He was very happy to help with projects but seemed a little shy of taking on an officer's role in the group. We were delighted that he finally agreed to become Club President for the year 2020/21, the year of Covid 19 and Lockdown. He seemed happy to continue into 2021/22 after a year in which there were so few meetings and all events were cancelled. We were all aware of his health problems but he was adamant he could carry on.

We have so many happy memories of our trips to France when he entered into the spirit of the visits despite s[peaking very little French We know our French Rotarian friends will be devastated to learn of his passing and any future visits will not be the same without him, thinking especially of Le Chapeau Rouge where he always enjoyed his lunch in surroundings which had become so familiar over successive visits.

We have wonderful recollections of International Dinners at 23 Benhill Road when Dorothy's cooking skills were celebrated by all assembled! The hammer for the chicken in a hard crust comes to mind!

We appreciated John's regular assistance with preparations for the Rotary Walk, putting out signs at some ungodly hour of the morning (a job he did right up to last May despite finding walking so very difficult).

And of course, everyone will remember how smart he was — so well dressed in suit and tie on almost every occasion.

John was very proud of his family and grandchildren. He was obviously very close with you all. We hope that you will have many happy memories together that will carry you over your grief to a better time.

# YOUTH SPEAKS AT THE BEACON SCHOOL



The first round of this competition was held at The Beacon School on Thursday 12th January 2023. The teams entered were an intermediate and senior team from Sutton Grammar School, and an intermediate team and senior team from from Wilsons School. The judges were Eileen Hannah, Wendy Phillips and Ros Rokison (Chair) who have all be involved in judging this competition in the past. Each team consisted of a Chairperson, Speaker for the

motion and a Speaker against the motion. The Chairman and Speakers were allotted the same time each . Rotarians organised the event and Rotarians from two clubs were involved in running the competition - Banstead, and Sutton Nonsuch Clubs The first to speak were the Sutton Grammar School intermediate team. Their chosen subject was "The voting age should be reduced to 16". Next to speak were the Wilsons intermediate team. Their subject was "Animal testing should be abolished". After this came Senior Team from Sutton Grammar School, the talk was on "No subject should be mandatory at GCSE". Finally came the Wilsons Senior Team. The subject was "Abolish the Monarchy". The winning team of the two intermediate schools was Wilsons and the winning team of the two Seniors was again Wilsons! The winners were each presented with a certificate and cash vouchers by Nonsuch Rotary President Chris Hughes and will go on to the next round of the competition. The judges said it was not easy to chose the winners as all the teams spoke well. The Beacon School provided tea and coffee for the interval while the judges made up their minds about who was the winner. Ros Rokison spoke for the judges and gave an excellent critique of the performance of each speaker.

#### CROCUS PLANTING

On Friday 6th January Banstead Rotary Club and the Banstead Village in Bloom joined forces to plant 4,000 crocus corms on the verge alongside Banstead Library in the village Why are we

doing this? Since 1985 Rotary's 1.4 million members worldwide have been working hard to rid the world of polio, a crippling disease that severely disables and even kills children. The purple crocus corms planted here and across Britain and Ireland during the Autumn each symbolise the purple dye painted on the little fingers of the 3 billion children worldwide when they have been vaccinated. To help raise money for the immunisations the Rotary movement has adopted the purple crocus. They will flower each February when Rotary celebrates its birthday. 

The worldwide Rotary Purple 4 Polio event on, or about, 24 October is a major Rotary initiative every year. Banstead Rotary also plants purple crocus corms to raise awareness with help from The Beacon School pupils and Banstead Village In Bloom.

The funds raised are used to immunise children around the World. Since Rotary began the project in 1988 they have raised \$2.1 billion and countless volunteer hours to protect nearly 3 billion children in over 122 countries worldwide!

On 25 September Jennifer Jones, President, Rotary International pledged an additional US150 million to the Global Polio Eradication Initiative. She wants this to be the start of a massive funding effort to reach the initiative's USD4.8 billion goal.
