
#### **THANK YOU JOHN!**

## Banstead Paul Harris Fellow 'Clocks Up' 47 Years Rotary Service!

Heartiest Congratulations to Rtn. John Draper MBE PHF for his immense service to Banstead Rotary Club. As a member who shared 37 of those years with John, we thought it right that I should add some personal memories to President Jane's congratulations.

Anyone who knows about John's contribution to club activity cannot fail to be impressed with the energy, enthusiasm and caring he brings to every task, which is why I have headed this piece with the Atlas icon, showing him bearing the weight of the Rotary world on his shoulders, with which I began every 'International' piece about him in the many years I edited the Newsletter. John's passion is always the success of the club.

John was President, when he welcomed me into the club in October 1988, one of 44 members at that time. I was privileged to take over from him as President in 2008/09 and he went on to fill that post on two more occasions, which was certainly Service Above 'Self'! John has worked in virtually every post in the club but there is no doubting that the special job for him was heading International Service – and especially nurturing the friendship link with our Contact club of Louviers le Neubourg in Normandy. He tirelessly maintains contact, raises hosting funds and promotes in every possible way this important facet of international entente and understanding. He introduced me to this activity in 1990, when he and Jean gave Joanne and me a lift to Louviers on that year's exchange visit. We were hooked from then on.

John's major second string to his bow was his leadership role in local Scouting – he was deservedly honoured in the New Years List 2000 with the MBE - the citation reading 'John Winston Draper, For services to Young People and to the Rotary Movement in Banstead.' So it came as no surprise when he recruited me to help with taking a Scout group all the way to Louviers to rough camp in the forest just outside the town at La Garde Chatel, an ancient domain, which had seen better days. I'm not sure which was more exciting: John and I careering down the coast to Louviers in a lorry packed to overflowing with everything needed to set up camp [including 17 bikes] – or lying awake each night in the tent listening for the snuffle of wild boar. John's




preparation and organization made it an excellent camp to remember with wonderful support from the Louviers Rotarians.

Successful as it is, the Louviers link is not the whole International Service story. John's work and leadership in a host of global projects is prodigious. In addition to the 'routine' work of paying the club's dues to the Rotary Foundation charity and ensuring substantial support for the Polio Eradication project – for which John has organised fundraisers from Raffles to Race Nights, Barn Dances and Plant and Book Stalls at the local Village Fair Day. Regular donations have been made to Shelter Box aid in disaster areas over many years and significant beneficiaries have been the 'Mercy Ships' and 'Jaipur Limb Centre' Charities. John organised the club's contribution to the District's matched-funding 'Sand Dams' project in Africa and we took on two international matched-funded projects of our own in the lovely but poor land-locked country of Lesotho. The first was to provide an upgraded Emergency Generator function at the remote mountain Hospital of Mantsonyane, after I had paid a visit there in 2009 and the second was to provide refurbished wheelchairs in that country. Both major projects and both, thanks to John's drive – entirely successful.

Skittles evenings, Stroke Awareness Day, substantial involvement at the annual Charity Walk – I could go on; John's 47 Rotary years have been action packed – an example to all of us.

HISTORY OF INNER WHEEL ON ITS CENTENARY - A
TALK BY DENISE DE LA PERRELLE







Banstead Rotary members were delighted to welcome Denise de la Perrelle as speaker on 7 th May.

She spoke about this year's Centenary of Inner Wheel and its history since being formed by Margarette Golding in Manchester in 1924.

Inner Wheel is one of the largest organizations for women in the world with more than 120,000 members in 100 countries. Originally it was for wives of Rotarians but is now open to all women over 18. Over £1M was raised in the UK alone during 2023.

Denise has a long history with Inner Wheel and Rotary as her parents were founder



members of both Banstead Rotary and Banstead Inner Wheel. Sadly, the Banstead Club has now closed due to members moving away and age and health took its toll but the good work continues with as some members joined the Inner Wheel Club of Carshalton.

She talked about the importance of Inner Wheel and Rotary working together and the difference they can make in today's troubled world.



She finished with a moving story about Hope and read a short poem used by her father at his conference many years ago, but still relevant for us all.

"So many Gods, so many Creeds
So many paths that wind and wind.
While just the art of being kind
Is all this sad world needs?"

## What Banstead Rotary Does! Christmas Collections

Christmas is a busy time of the year for Banstead Rotarians. We are proud we still maintain a Santa's sleigh. We brave the winter weather to tour the streets of Banstead with Santa to the delight of the young and young at

heart. We are helped by local charity partners.

We also supply Christmas trees to local schools. But our biggest Christmas tree, which we select and cut personally, is reserved for pride of place in the centre of the roundabout at the start of Banstead High Street.

Through our Christmas collection programme, we aim to raise £10,000 to £12,000 each year.



#### Charity Walk



In the month of May we put on a charity walk from Tattenham Corner and across Epsom Downs.

Over 80 walkers usually take part in this annual event.

Members of Banstead Rotary and friends act as reception and stewards along the route. The main purpose of the walk is to raise money for charity.

Local charity groups in Banstead and the Surrey neighbourhood are at the forefront of the walk. Alongside them are individuals supporting other local charities.

This event raises over £6,000 for local charities.

#### Village Fair



In July each year we facilitate the Banstead Rotary Village Fair with over 30 stall holders representing a wide variety of local charities and organisations. There is music throughout the day and "The Orchard" is a colourful delight. This is a hugely enjoyable event which, as well as raising funds for local charities, raises the profiles of these organisations.

The importance of the event is in raising the profile of local groups and charities. The Rotary Club focuses on the organisation of the event as a key priority each year.
